Message from Dr Muhammad Tariq, Interim Associate Dean, Education



2019 has been a rewarding year; excellent and diligent work by educational and department coordinators, Year Chairs and cooperation of faculty has led to banking of 882 new questions in UGME which includes 498 MCQ, 329 EMQ, 55 SAQ/ISAQ and 23 OSCE

stations; 590 new questions in PGME which includes 558 MCQ and 32 SAQ/ ISAQ; 505 new MCQ from SONAM. New academic year is now underway and I look forward to the usual support from all.

Our Research day had an overwhelming response and Dean Haider has requested all presenters to share their work in the academic literature, so a reminder to all presenters to begin work on publications. A retreat for restructuring the ISC-HPE, was held and an excellent response was seen from the invited faculty. The process of redesigning the course has been initiated and soon the revamped course will be offered to the faculty.

To enhance the academic standards of Medical Education at AKU we are in dialogue with Umbrella Consortium for Assessment Network (UCAN) which is an international network with the aim to enhance quality of examinations. We are hopeful that this collaboration will further strengthen the assessments at AKU. In 2019 six of our students graduated in HPE. Our Heartiest congratulations to them. Last but not least many congratulations to our wonderful and passionate educators: Dr Qamar Riaz and Dr Sana Saeed for achieving the Outstanding Teacher awards. This honor is a witness to their hard work and dedication. Congratulation for your achievement!

Faculty in Focus

Dr Tabassum Zehra, an Assistant Professor at the DED, AKU, is the first graduate of the AKU MHPE Programme. She went on to complete her PhD in Medical Education from University Ambrosiana, Italy, building on her previous work on Clinical Supervision from needs assessment to development of a Competency-Outcome-Based Model of Effective Clinical Supervision, the first in the region. Prior to working at AKU, she worked as Deputy Dean Medical Education at the College of Physicians and Surgeons Pakistan, where she developed the standard protocol for proposal submission for approval of all new courses. At AKU she took many new initiatives and restructured the Year 5 clerkship assessments. Currently, Dr Zehra holds the positions of Programme Director MHPE, Chair Faculty Development Workshop Series and Director Residents as Educators Programme.

She is actively involved in teaching within and outside AKU. She has also conducted workshops at International Conferences, including the Association for Medical Education in Europe (AMEE) conference in 2016.

Her pre conference workshop on 'Competency Based Clinical Supervision' has been accepted in AMEE 2020 at

Glasgow. She is the Chair of Academic Council Pakistan of Medics International. Dr Zehra is a reviewer of national and editor in international journals. Her areas of interest include Clinical Supervision, Leadership, Competency Based Medical Education, Learner Feedback, Faculty Development.

Restructuring of Introductory Short Course in HPE

ISC-HPE is a 5 day course offered by DED. It introduces the faculty to different instructional and assessment strategies, and the educational philosophies underpinning Health Professions Education. This course is mandatory for all faculty members joining AKU and is also a pre-requisite for the MHPE Programme. This course was first offered in 2005 and has been running since then thrice a year. In January 2020, the 45th course was offered. Although it has evolved considerably during last decade, a need was identified for a review of the course with the aim of:

- Ensuring relevance to AKU and national needs
- Adopting innovative teaching learning trends & technologies
- Enhancing feasibility for faculty

To ensure engagement of wider stakeholders in the revision of ISC, a retreat was held on October 11, 2019. This retreat was attended by 35 faculty members from different departments. Dean Haider, appreciated the initiative in his opening address. Following this retreat a committee was constituted which is currently working on restructuring ISC in view of the recommendations that resulted from this retreat.

Curiosity Advocacy Inquiry Molecule for Debriefing

Debriefing is the crucial component of learning through simulation. It makes your learner reflect on their practice and thus develop strategies to improve their performance in similar situations in the future. It is very important for the debriefer to ensure psychological safety through this process. Though the critical judgment of the expert is essential for learning through simulation, often it doesn't facilitate in reach the desired outcomes. The Advocacy Inquiry Model of Debriefing facilitates debriefing through good judgment. It helps you in identifying the learner's frame (assumptions, prior experience etc.). These frames leads to the actions which they take during the simulation exercises.

Steps:

- Reaction: Begin your discussion by identifying the learner's feeling (e.g. "Sara how are you feeling right now?!"
- Body: There are three components embedded in the main body of this model;
 - 1. Advocacy: Quote your perspective (what you know or have seen or observe) here (e.g. Sara I saw you did not introduce yourself to the family. I believe connecting with the family helps in better communication during patient management)
 - 2. Curiosity and Inquiry: Show your curiosity to hear your learner's frame behind any actions you want to make an inquiry about. (E.g. I am curious to know how you see this.)
 - 3. **Summary:** Wrap up the session by asking your learners about major take home messages which will help them to enhance their performance in future.
