## Message from Dr Muhammad Tariq, Interim Associate Dean, Education



The recent pandemic has led to a unique and challenging situation for university academics. Globally educationists are struggling to determine ways of engaging students with course work in an online environment. While virtual learning has many advantages it comes with challenges for

clinical teaching where many skills cannot be taught remotely. There is a similar concern for ensuring validity and reliability of the assessment.

Facing a pandemic is a once in a lifetime situation, both for faculty and students. To share and keep all abreast with the current knowledge of COVID-19 as well as pandemics in general, a very successful online course titled COVINAR was hosted jointly by DED, DCPE and Dean's Office, Medical College with over 5000 registrations.

The aim of this course was to empower the health care professionals to meet the current health care challenge most effectively.

For effective functioning in times of pandemic and later too, DED has introduced 5 tips, a series of concise tips for health care professionals.

In order to maintain the continuum of educational processes, a monthly MCQ review with Medical College and SONAM has been taken to virtual platform. # Transitioning to Online Learning in the Age of Social Distancing

Due to closure of campuses in response to the coronavirus, many educators will be teaching remotely for the first time. Here are some best practices to consider

### 1. Planning & Preparation of courses

- The SAMR (Substitute, Augment, Modify, and Redefine) model outlines how educators can use technology to transition curricular content from in person to online.
- Decide how much (if any) of the course to change and mix synchronous and asynchronous learning.
- Any tool(s) chosen must be for educational reasons, not simply because of it's availability.

#### 2. Challenges & considerations to address

- Maintaining motivation and engagement is an issue for longer online courses.
- What technologies are in place; what works well for mass education, what doesn't?
- Can the system / bandwidth cope with live teaching, streaming etc?
- Do teachers and students know how to use the systems or do they require faculty development?

#### 3. Discussion boards and online discussions

- Use discussion boards to post questions for student critical thinking. Make sure to set an end time for students to respond.
- Encourage students to respond to other students comments and post questions to move the discussion forward.
- Check with your institution to see if they have WebEx, Google Classroom, Zoom, MS Teams or any other virtual meeting platform.

### 4. Motivation & engagement to optimize online learning

- Require students to complete quizzes prior to class, thus ensuring required content has been read.
- Get students to drive the class and speak to the clarification of the content that they have read.
- Identify and address at-risk or half-hearted students using the adaptive quizzes and provide continuous feedback to learners.

### 5. Practical & Clinical teaching

- Virtual patient simulators provide a safe virtual environment for medical students and physicians to cultivate Clinical diagnostic skills.
- Software for simulating biological systems allow students to simulate laboratory experiments as well as learn about the effects of standard medical interventions.
