Surgeons' Log

A year in Egypt for my Renal Transplant Fellowship



Mansoura is capital of Dakahlia governorate and also known as Pearl of Delta. The Urology and Nephrology Center (UNC)at Mansoura was founded in 1983 to provide comprehensive treatment and research opportunity, as bladder cancer was endemic in Egypt due to bilharziasis. Over the years it has become world renowned, in the areas of renal transplant, urological oncology, female urology, pediatric urology and minimal invasive urology. I had opportunity to join this prestigious institute for one year, as a part of my renal transplant surgery fellowship. UNC is a 260-bed hospital with

six operating rooms, performing three or more cases of renal transplant every week. Being the only fellow in academic year 2106-2017, I was instantly welcomed as part of surgical team. The first few weeks were difficult to adjust with the new place, and spice free Egyptian food, but pretty soon, I realized that cooking Pakistani food myself, would be my only option. Luckily, I was joined by another colleague and this brought a sigh of relief.



I never got a chance to leave Mansoura in the first few months but later on, I started my exploration with Ras El Bar (Head of land), a small town two-hour drive from Mansoura, where Nile ends in Mediterranean Sea. The place was so beautiful that I ended up visiting it several times. We also explored Alexandria over a weekend, and stayed in an apartment, right on the shore. We visitedthe Citadel of Qaitbay, the 15th-century defensive fortress located on the Mediterranean sea coast. Montaza Palace was another attractive place where we spent hours. The famous Alexandria Library is both a library and a cultural center,

and also houses a small museum. This building is trade mark of modern architecture in Egypt. We also saw Pompey's pillar column of single Aswan granite with height of 26.85 m.

I also had the opportunity to attend several hands-on workshops and courses, and also supervised vascular anastomosis workshop arranged by Egyptian society of renal transplant surgery. On off days, I was assigned to assist a senior surgeon in complex cases and it was a great experience to work with Professor Hassan Abol –Enien, a well-known international figure in field of bladder cancer and urinary diversion.





I also attended the Annual Congress of Egyptian Urological Association at Sharam-El-Sheikh, and took this opportunity to explore Red Sea. SOHO Square and Naama Bay are other important places tovisit. Ras Mohammad National Park is a preserved area in Red Seaand this was the site for my first diving experience.

Most memorable time in Mansoura was during holy month of Ramadan which I spent attending iftar parties organized by faculty members. I woremy traditional shalwar kameez to these parties, that drew quite an attention. Mahshi is local dish


(stuffed rice with meat, wrapped in wine leaves) is essential part of dinner, other than this stem fish and meat are also integral part of dining.



Cairo was the last city I visited. The National Museum at Tahrir square is a must-see. Human mummies and even animal mummies are well preserved. Mohammad Ali Pasha mosque is another attraction, and the architecture and design of this mosque in not different from those in Istanbul. Great Giza pyramids are one of the wonders of the world. Three mountainous pyramids and many small ones (some are vanishing away) are connected with each through underground network of tunnels.

Majority of these tunnels are closed now. However local guide were hardly of any use. I was lucky to be joined by my family for a couple of weeks during school holidays. Sharm El Sheikh was the city kids enjoyed most.

My Seven Days in Tibet



When you hear the word Tibet it conjures up images of monks, meditation and mountain peaks covered with snow. Tibet is known as the roof of the world with an average elevation of 15000 feet. This enigmatic and striking abode is a plateau north of the Himalayas and has attracted throngs of adventure seekers from around the world. I was sufficiently motivated to go, soon after, two of my cousins agreed to accompany me. We set aside our trepidations of altitude sickness and embarked on the trip on April 8th 2018.

We arrived at Katmandu in Nepal on our first leg and found the city surrounded by verdant mountains on three sides, filled with tourists and, abundant historic temples and pagodas. Religion seemed intensely woven into the daily fabric of life. We saw numerous statues of goddesses, monkey filled temples, and saffron draped sadhus. During our two night stay here we were able to obtain Chinese visas and Tibet entry permits.

The flight to Lhasa was breathtaking as we crossed the world's highest summit Mount Everest. The jagged massive peak was clearly visible in all its golden glory. Lhasa is 13000 ft above sea level, a unique and spiritual city, flanked on all sides by majestic snow covered mountains. There was no feeling of altitude sickness yet. We walked around observing the everyday life of Tibetans. Nearly all of them are Buddhists (only 3% Muslims). The landscape is picturesque with snowcapped mountains, sparkling rivers and lakes. We visited the JOKHANG TEMPLE with spinning prayer wheels and monks softly humming mantras to themselves.



Hundreds of pilgrims were performing "full body prostration" expressing deeply spiritual faith to purify the bad karma. We wandered through the masses and the mazes that constitute the famous "BARKHOR BAZAAR". Devotees performed circumambulation, holding prayer beads as they moved in a clockwise direction.



Next day we visited the SERA MONASTERY built in circa 1419 also known as the "Wild Roses Monastery". This is one of the "great three" schools of Tibetan Buddhism. Here women wore colorful Tibetan costumes and monks roamed in their deep maroon colored robes. We had to climb up the slopes and several hundred steps. We quickly became out of breath and tired but the sights and sounds were so enchanting it kept us going. Inside the monastery we saw a centuries old tradition of "philosophical debate" amongst the monks, being held in white, pebbled courtyards. There were about a hundred monks in pairs chanting animatedly with each other while performing a

routine of slapping themselves in a frenzy, helping them learn the Buddhist philosophy. It was captivating to watch. Our next stop was the SUMMER PALACE built for the 7th Dalai Lama in the 1700's. Subsequently it became home for successive Dalai Lamas including the current 14th Dalai Lama till his exile in 1959

when the Chinese military took over the country. Next day we visited the "DREPUNG MONASTERY" established in AD1416. It's the world's largest monastery housing 10,000 monks. In Tibet it becomes evident very soon that five primary colors (blue, white, red, green and yellow) hold a huge significance representing five pure lights, each of which signify a state of mind, a celestial Buddha, a body part, and a mantra from the word Hum.

Next day we visited the world famous "POTALA PALACE", a masterpiece of sacred architecture and the residence of Dalai Lama. The climb to the top of the fortress is not for the weary of mind and body. I thought of it as a closest thing one finds to a "stairway to heaven". The view of the Himalayas from the top of the palace was magical. We collapsed several times gasping for air on our ascent to the top. That day we did 20,000 steps and vowed never to do it again. We saw eight stupas in the palace largest being 50ft tall. These are the Buddhist tombs for the burial of sacred Dalai Lamas. Potala Palace has 1000 rooms, 10,000 shrines and about



200,000 statues. Inside there is the tomb of the 7th Dalai Lama "the Great One" encased in 4000 kg of gold.



After three days in Lhasa our next destination was the MOST awaited. We embarked on our Journey to the EVEREST BASE CAMP. We travelled along the Friendship Highway on an 8 hour journey to SHIGATSE the second biggest city in Tibet. We passed KHAMBA LA at the elevation of 15800 feet where we savored the majestic views of Turquoise YAMDROK-TSO Lake, one of the three "Holy Lakes" in Tibet. Along the long winding highway we passed an enchanting village called GYANSTE which prides on having a 14th century historical KUMBUM fort with a large gold domed stupa. We then descended into Shigatse (elevation 14500 feet)

and visited Tashilhunpo monastery residence of successive Pancham Lama, a major attraction in Shigatse. The next day we continued our journey on another 8 hour drive through a Small town called Lhatse. We then went through GYAMTSO LA pass elevation 17400 feet. We continued our drive south passing through PANG LA PASS elevation 18000 feet, eventually arriving at RONGBUK that has a monastery of the same name. This is the highest monastery built anywhere in the world at 17300 feet. Here we reached the EVEREST BASE CAMP. Our abode for the next two nights would be in the tents made of Yak skin and thick, woven, woolen fibers made from Yak hair. The hikers/climbers who go on the Everest climb take their first test at this point, hiking 2kms to the foothills of the mighty mountain. Finally we were there. The feeling of awe was indescribable. I must say it was truly an emotional experience. We were only 19 kilometers from the world's tallest summit. I was humbled by the might of nature and our insignificance in the scheme of things. I urge you all to do it.

Surgery through the Ages

the Portuguese Genius who was awarded Noble Prize, but for the wrong achievement.

In this issue, we are making an exception by not presenting the story of a surgeon. Instead, we are presenting the story of a physician, with a profound historical influence on two entirely separate surgical procedures. Egas Moniz (1874 - 1955) a Portuguese Neurologist, is credited with the development of cerebral angiography, that completely revolutionized intracranial imaging, and a few decades later, has emerged as the basis for the introduction of a variety of safer, and more effective minimally invasive treatment options for several neurosurgical and neurological conditions. It wouldn't be unfair to say that cerebral angiography was one of the most important innovations of the last century. Egas was nominated for Noble prize at least twice (thrice by some accounts) for the development of angiography, although he was turned down each time. However, and this is where it gets even more interesting, Egas

did receive a Noble prize (shared with Walter Rudolf Hess), for the introduction of 'leucotomy' (better known by its American name, lobotomy), a procedure which laid the foundations for 'psychosurgery' and is widely considered as one of the most horrid surgical interventions ever published. Even though Egas never once performed the surgery himself, owing perhaps due to his lack of surgical training, but more likely due to his disabling gout, he is considered the 'father of psychosurgery', and also credited with the first use of the term 'psychosurgery'.

So what is this horrid procedure? The leucotomy (a subject of several papers, documentaries, books of fiction and horror movies), was based on the observation that removing the frontal lobes of a chimpanzee made it calmer and more cooperative. Soldiers with injuries to frontal lobes (a reasonably common pattern in those days), were also found to have "changes in character and personality", in Moniz's own words. Egas conceived that partial destruction of frontal lobes, especially the white mater tracts, may give the same result in certain psychiatric patients. He convinced a neurosurgeon Almeida Lima to perform the procedure on 20 patients, initially using chemical destruction of white matter tracts using absolute alcohol, and later using a 'leucotome' a needle-like instrument with a wire-loop at one end, thereby replacing chemical destruction by mechanical one. Egas reported 'excellent' results, which later on, were widely criticized on the grounds of ethics, safety, and even the credibility of scientific data. The procedure was popularized in North America through Walter Freeman and James Watts, who adopted a modified technique and renamed it "lobotomy." The procedure became immensely popular, and remained so for at least two decades, eventually falling out of favor, but not before several thousand patients had undergone it. According to estimates, from between 1940 and 1950, almost 20,000 leucotomies (lobotomies since it was in US) had been performed in the United States alone and proportionally more in the United Kingdom, majority on women. In fact, a study of American hospitals found nearly 60% of leucotomy patients were women; and another study from Canada reported 74% of leucotomies were performed on women.

As if being one of the very few people in world to achieve three (or four) Noble prize nominations, and eventually a Noble prize; and introducing a revolutionary diagnostic and therapeutic procedure (cerebral angiography, not leucotomy) weren't enough, Egas was also involved in high-level national politics. In fact, he served on a number of important political positions including a Portuguese Member of Parliament, Minister for External Affairs, Ambassador to Spain, and also represented Portugal at the historic 1918 Versailles Peace Conference, all before his experiments with angiography and psychosurgery. Next time you hear an excuse for not writing, remember this, despite the illustrious career mentioned above, Egaz was also a prolific writer, and not just contributed immensely to the scientific literature, but also authored on sexology, and two (yes, two) autobiographies. He attracted a lot of negative publicity for his series of controversial graphic books, A Vida Sexual (a sexual life).

Egas at 37 years of age, was a Professor at the University of Lisbon, where he worked for 33 years (including his break for politics), and went on to become the Dean of Medical School. Even as Dean, he couldn't stay out of mainstream news, getting himself arrested (one of his three known police arrests) for preventing police from settling a student-run protest.

Egaz spent his last 16 years in a wheelchair, after being shot multiple times by an unhappy patient. The carotid siphon, the twisting of the internal carotid artery inside the temporal bone, was reported by Egaz, and has been named after him, as the Egas Moniz's siphon.






From a Surgeon's Bookshelf

The Monk Who Sold His Ferrari

The book is a good read and it helps us to weigh our desires against our needs towards a happier existence. Succeed we all might, but the question is have we really succeeded? - ➤ Embrace The Present: Live for today stop looking ahead and waiting for things to be better down the road; enjoy things as they happen.



From a Surgeon's Bookshelf

Aurangzeb: The Man and the Myth, by Audrey Truschke

Surely the jewel of the Royal Library at Windsor Castle is the Padshahnama that visually chronicles the reign of Emperor Shah Jahan. This sumptuous feast of colors that are pristine400 years on is a delight to behold, and one arresting image documents the cerebrated event at a royal tournament in 1633 when a crazed elephant stampeded towards the royal party. The youthful Aurangzeb exhibiting great courage, charges the elephant and attacks it with a spear to drive it away. His elder brothers DaraShikoh and Shah Shuja are seen to lurk at some distance from the danger and in the illustration are pictured behind their father, seemingly apprehensive. The Emperor was greatly impressed by his younger son's bravery and besides awarding him the title Bahadur, had him weighed in gold. It does not require a flight of fancy to conjecture that this event germinated in Aurangzeb's mind the idea

that he was a man of destiny and in her slim but insightful biography Audrey Truschke certainly portrays him as a man with a mission.

His great grandfather Akbar extended the empire at its eastern and southern reaches in the main by alliances and treaties with hindu rulers. Aurangzeb had a different mindset and spent many years of his 49 year long reign on campaign to secure and expand the empire. This brought him in to brutal conflict with the hindu rajas, and their historiography and that of the British colonial writers, has projected him in bad light. This animus has intensified in more recent times with the ascent of hindu nationalism in Indian political life and the ruler who expanded the Mughal empire both geographically and economically to unprecedented heights, is widely reviled as a religious bigot, a hindu hater and temple demolisher. In 2015, Delhi's Aurangzeb road was renamed in a vengeful act of historic revisionism.

Truschke is an academic historian at Rutgers University and a specialist in South Asian history but has produced an eminently readable and compressed account without losing the flavor of authenticity. Her bibliographical essay at the end of the book attests to an extensive survey ofprimary and secondary sources and she has tracked down numerous Imperial Firmans and letters to make her case. Aurangzeb in her view took himself and his responsibility very seriously being preoccupied with the idea of being a just and equitable ruler devoted to the welfare of his subjects. He also viewed the Empire as a legacy of Timur and Akbar given to him in trust to protect and nourish. His dire responses to seditions and rebellions are to be seen through this lens of obligation. She questions on authority the neo-legends of whole scale razing of temples and forced conversions and points to royal documents that tell of grants of land and money to hindu holy men and temples, his good terms with yogis and such like. In his

reign the numbers of hindu state officials and notables increased significantly compared to the court of his predecessors. And though he became increasingly religious later in this life he still admonishes in one letter, a local official for mistreating hindus.



This book was not uniformly well received in India and though some took the message that Aurangzeb needs to be assessed as a product of his circumstance and time, many derided the author for undertaking a fool's errand in her attempt to humanize him. Even in Pakistan the issue is debated and a recent play "Dara" by Lahore-based playwright Shahid Nadeem

revolves around the well-worn historical "what if" that conjectures a different trajectory to subcontinental history if DaraShikoh, Shah Jehan's first born son and favorite were to have become the 6th Mughal emperor rather than Aurangzeb. Truschke takes issue with this and makes the point that Shikoh was ill-suited and ill-prepared for the job. It is worth reading this work to be able to make up your own mind.
